





ParentSquare

- Communication platform to give families options on how to receive information from each school/teacher in LWSD

Power Groups

- Students will have a Reading and Math Power Group
- During Power Groups, multiple teachers will support the third grade to provide targeted instruction for each student.
- Third graders will be grouped based on skills they need to work on, so this will be an
 opportunity for enrichment, reteaching, group projects, and small group
 instruction.
- Groups will change periodically throughout the year and students will likely be grouped with third graders from other classes.
- Power Groups do not replace core instruction, they are meant to be supplemental
 learning opportunities.
